When patients receive a nerve block for anesthesia they often receive sedation during the surgery. But they may also receive general anesthesia. Bandage/splint/surgical dressing care. Please keep your hand elevated as much and as often as possible for 2-4 days after surgery. This helps reduce swelling, and your hand may throb and feel worse if it is hanging down.

- Right after your surgery, you will be in a long arm cast that extends from your fingertips to above your elbow. This cast will help control swelling and protect your hand.
- You can begin physical therapy 1 to 2 days after surgery with this cast.
