- 3 Khmer Air Force AU-24s were shot down during operations against the Khmer Rouge - 1 Khmer Air Force crashed into the Tonkin Gulf due to lack of fuel on 17 April 1975 - of the AU-24s captured by the Khmer Rouge, at least one bore the insignia of the Heng Samrin regime after 1979; it was at Boun Kak park, Phnom Penh, in 1993, but broken up
